Hearings by Telephone or Video

Judges at the Office of State Administrative Hearings (OSAH) are equipped to engage in administrative hearings by phone or video. OSAH uses an application called **GoToMeeting**, which can connect the litigants and the Judge by phone or by video. Here's how it works:

Phone

- OSAH gives you a call-in number and a unique access code. This information will appear on a Notice of Hearing or Continuance Order, along with the date and time to call in. You do not need to download the GoToMeeting App; you simply call the number and punch in the access code.
- If you have witnesses you wish to question during the hearing, it is your responsibility to share the call-in information and access code with those individuals.
- Prior to the scheduled phone hearing, you must submit copies of your exhibits to both the Court and the opposing party. Your Judge will give you a deadline for submitting these exhibits carefully review all Notices and Orders for this and any other instructions.

<u>Video</u>

- Parties interested in appearing by video can submit a request to the Judge's Assistant.
- If all participants are willing to use video, you will be sent a link to access GoToMeeting. You will need to download the app in order to use the video feature.
- As a practical matter, laptops and tablets are easier to use than smartphones. However, any device that has a camera can use GoToMeeting's video application.
- If you have witnesses you wish to question during the hearing, it is your responsibility to share the link with those witnesses <u>and</u> ensure they have video access.
- Prior to the scheduled video hearing, you must submit copies of your exhibits to both the Court and the opposing party. Your Judge will give you a deadline for submitting these exhibits carefully review all Notices and Orders for this and any other instructions.

Note: Under Georgia law, all parties to a case must consent to the conduct of an administrative hearing by remote telephonic communications. O.C.G.A. § 50-13-15(5); Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 616-1-2-.22(4). It is your right to have an in-person hearing. If you object to a phone or video hearing, please submit your written objection to OSAH at least two (2) business days before the scheduled hearing.
